

In FYE 2022, Mourning Hope served 1,564 unique individuals; a 30% increase in direct service utilization over FYE 2021, following an 89.7% increase the prior fiscal year.

 That's 192 grief counseling clients

 That's 427 grief consultations

 That's 945 grief support group participants

Mourning Hope also provided **194 community grief presentations** in FYE 2022, reaching an additional **4,032** individuals.

Receiving no government funding or insurance reimbursement for programs, Mourning Hope relies solely on private donations from individuals, businesses, service clubs and foundations in order to provide **no-cost** services to those who need it most.

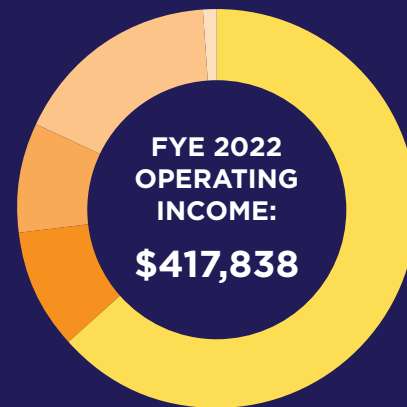
